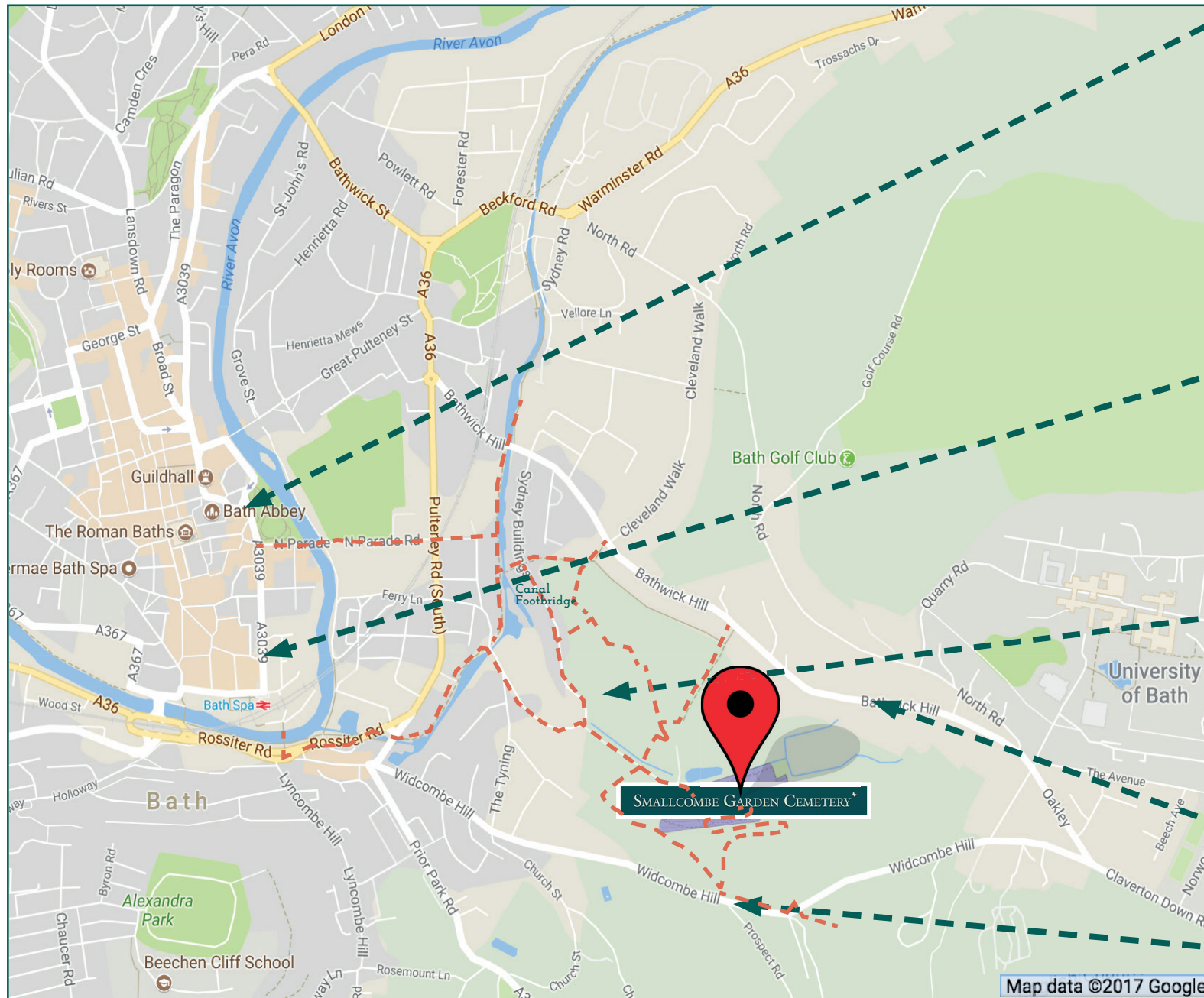


# Directions To Smallcombe

--- Indicates Walking routes



**From Abbey**  
Follow North Parade Road. After crossing the river and arriving at the T-junction, cross over the main road and continue under an archway and along a footpath and finally up steps to the canal. Turn right and then left across the canal footbridge. Cross the road ahead and continue up a further set of steps to a gate on the right into the National Trust field. Keep walking across the field through three gates before veering right and then downhill to a gate with farm buildings ahead. Go through the gate and down a track with the farm buildings now to your left. When you arrive at the intersection with the private road turn left and the cemetery gates are about 50 metres up the road.

**From Bath Spa Station**  
From the rear exit of the station cross the river via the footbridge, then turn left walking along Rossiter Road, the river will be on your left and at the first left turn you will be able to pick up the canal path which goes underneath the main road. Continue along the canal path until you come to the next road bridge where you exit right along Horseshoe Walk. At the first sharp bend you will see the private road that leads to the cemetery.

**From Horseshoe Walk**  
Follow the private road by foot only. It leads to the main double gate of the cemetery at the very end of this driveway. Proceed through the main gate, and to the right, you will find the Smallcombe Information Board. Alternatively, enter the cemetery via the other small side gate to the right just before you reach the main gate.

**From Bathwick Hill**  
Use the postcode BA2 6LA. Parking on the road just below the Youth Hostel and following the bridle footpath down the hill into the fields.

**From National Trust - Skyline Walk**  
Use the Stile at Widcombe Hill and follow footpaths through the Wood.

**Please note:** There is no parking at the cemetery, it is only accessible by foot. There are also no facilities on-site. Some paths have permissive rights of way only as they cross private land. Please respect the paths.
